Some of you are aware we have a Twitter account and we use this account to promote children's work, events, links to useful websites and anything else we feel would communications between home and school. Pupil Premium

On the news today it highlighted that parents and carers are not accessing this very useful resource and therefore we are not able to access this money to aid the development of our children. Although all children in Early Years and Key Stage One have a free school meal this funding is very different from Pupil Premium.

The Government gives money to schools to help children from lower income families and includes children adopted from care, children with Residency Orders and children under Special Guardianship Order. This funding is called, 'Pupil Premium' and should not be confused with Universal Infant Free School Meals, which is the provision of hot meals for children in Early Years and Key Stage One.

If you believe you are able to apply for Pupil Premium I urge you to do so or come and have a chat with me. Registering is really quick and easy - if you think you qualify, you can register online (https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/education-children-and-families/schools-and-colleges/free-school-meals/free-school-meals-online-application/).

This money is there to be used but we need your help to access it. If schools do not use this money it will be returned to the Government and distributed to another pot, which will probably not be education. With funding so tight and West Sussex being one of the lowest funded areas per pupil, we need to ensure that we use every available funding at our disposal.

Splash Time
