School Sport Recognition

One sunny day a man who was a farmer was gathering food for the Harvest Festival. He worked all alone with no help, he was not happy. He watched people, with help, working together. The farmer just sat down upset until all the people of the town came to help. Together they gathered food and when they were done they had a big celebration.

Walk to School Project (WOW)

On Wednesday, 14th September Strider came to visit Petworth Primary School to introduce our fantastic Walk to School project (WOW). At the end of the school day he was very excited to meet the children and parents, and give out Walk to School badges.

The children will have the opportunity to earn eleven badges across the year by walking, scooting, or biking to school. They can also use park and stride, parking at least five minutes away from the school and walking in. Each class will be logging their journey daily and if they do any of the above eight times a month, they can earn their badge.

At home you can help by encouraging your child to walk to school, or by parking a little further away and walking the last 5-10 minutes. You can also discuss the benefits of walking to school, such as; healthier bodies and minds, reducing pollution and congestion at the schools gates and making the road to school a safer place to be. The teachers are even getting involved, with many pledging to park and stride at least four times a month.

We are very excited about this project and look forward to seeing larger numbers of our children walking to school across the academic year.





Reading in School

As you may be aware we are trying to raise the profile of reading across the school and we have set ourselves an aspirational target that every child will get the chance to read with an adult at least once a week in school. We will complete this with the children working with teacher, teaching assistants and volunteers.

In Key Stage One the classes are continuing with the Reading Rockets and the children can move up to the next level every time they read at home and their Reading Record is completed.

We have slightly adapted the Reading Lightyears Challenge and this will now reflect how many times the children read at home. Therefore if a child reads five times a week for six weeks they will receive a gold award. The reading the children complete in school does not count towards this challenge.
