## On the Farm



### Maths

In maths this term we will be focusing on measurement, multiplication and division. This will include halving and doubling numbers up to 20. We will be exploring division by teaching the children to equally share the number out into groups to find the answer. Children will also be comparing weight and capacity, as well as recording the units of weight, so any discussion at home about weight and size, for example, helping out with baking, will be really useful.

### R.E



This term we will be looking into the importance of churches. This will include exploring different types of churches and the different artefacts you can find within them. We will also discuss the importance of church in communities and people's personal lives. We will link this to our value of service by exploring how we can serve, for example, volunteering. Our other value this term of courage will link to our work on Olympics.

## Learning Experience

### On the Farm

This experience will be focused on farms. We will be using the book Mrs. Wishy Washy's Farm by Joy Cowley, who will write to us asking us to adopt a farm animal. The visit from a farm will give the children chance to meet a range of farmyard animals. This will lead to them researching the animal and how to care for them. During this we will also be looking at the effect Seasons have on farming and the progression of farm machinery. We are hoping to share what we have learnt with the other classes .

### Art Week



We will be creating a collaborative piece of art for the school. This will look at the illustrations of Jeannie Baker books to inspire us! If you have any material, old clothes or oddments, you are happy to be cut up, please bring them in for us to use.
