Literacy



Curriculum Experiences

This experience will take place from the 11th April until 13th May. We will read Mrs Wishy Washy's Farm and find out how to care for all the different farm animals. We will also use our imaginations to design and make homes for all the animals to live in.

Art experience

This experience will take place from the 16th May until 27th May. During this experience, the children will create a beautiful piece of art work, based on a favourite book, which will be displayed around the school.
