#### Democracy...

On Friday Beech, Maple and Elm classes learnt more about Like many of you, I attended the Remembrance Service at 3pm democracy as they debated the argument, 'Was Guy Fawkes trying to end democracy?' as part of our Parliament Week. During the week, all of the children learnt about the facts of the case and then they had to interpret the information and make up their mind to see if they believed what Guy Fawkes was doing was right or not.

The children learnt a multitude of vocabulary as well as learning about the supposed etiquette of the House of Commons; how to argue and justify their argument; and hopefully gain some understanding of the complexity of why Guy Fawkes was part of the Gunpowder Plot.

#### **Hockey Tournament**

Last Friday we took twelve players (two teams) to participate in



the latest MRC sporting event. Our children were enthusiastic with their mouth guards in, shin pads on and hockey sticks at the ready. After a few warm ups they were ready to play. Considering
