We are very much looking forward to them visiting us in the summer term and will be writing recounts of our experience over the next week.




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## Elm Class Pizza Afternoon

## SENAT Appointments

The SEN Assessment Team (SENAT) have arranged for members of their team to be in local venues across the county to offer appointments with parents. These sessions are prioritised for parents whose children are going through the EHC needs assessment, however if the available appointments are not filled they can be used for anyone who would find it helpful to meet a member of the team.

Please note different team members attend different sessions, therefore your allocated Planning Co-Ordinator may not always be available but team members will liaise closely with each other. The sessions have now been booked in for the spring term and details can be found on the Local Offer at [googl.cfyj0b](http://googl.cfyj0b) or by contacting your planning co-ordinator.



## Annual Reviews for an EHC Plan

An Annual Review should be an important part of your child's young person's EHC Plan and gives opportunity to discuss whether any amendments are needed. The Annual Review itself is a process, (not just the meeting) and this process is not completed until the following steps have all been done.

1. An annual review meeting must take place to discuss the EHC plan.
2. Information must be gathered from parents and young people and from professionals about the EHC plan and then circulated two weeks before the meeting.
3. After the meeting a report of what happened must be prepared and circulated to everyone who attended or submitted information to be discussed.
4. After the meeting the LA reviews the EHC plan.
5. After the meeting the LA reviews the EHC Plan and must notify the parent of the child or young person of their decision within four weeks of the meeting.
6. There are only 3 decisions the LA can make:
  - a) To maintain the EHC plan in its current format (not make any changes);
  - b) To amend the EHC plan (including change of named school in Section I)
  - c) To cease the EHC plan if they think it is no longer necessary for it to be in place

If the LA have not informed you of their decision (re point 6 above) within four weeks of the annual review meeting taking place then you should contact your Planning Coordinator in writing. Remember to keep a copy of any letter or email you send.

**Other things to note for special circumstances:**

A. For those transferring from secondary school to a post-16 institution, the EHC plan must be reviewed and amended by 31 March in the year of transfer.

B. From Year 9 onwards, the local authority has a duty to ensure that the annual review meeting "consider[s] what provision is required to assist the child or young person in preparation for adulthood and independent living". Discussions about their future should focus on what they want to achieve and the best way to support them to achieve. Planning must be centred around the individual and explore the child or young person's aspirations and abilities, what they want to be able to do when they leave post-16 education or training and the support they need to achieve their ambition.

C. For all other phases of transfer, the deadline is 15 February in the year of transfer for the EHC Plan to be reviewed and amended.

D. For those transferring schools, after the review, the EHC plan should state that they will continue to attend their current setting until the end of the academic year (or another date if different), and then name the setting they will attend from the start of the next academic year.
