Petworth Area Schools (PAS) Cross Country

On Wednesday 3rd October the latest cross country event took Please remember to take a look at your child's class blog to place at Petworth Park. Three schools took part; Duncton, Fittleworth and ourselves. In total 148 year four, five and six children (67 girls and 81 boys) ran just over a mile on a very tough course. Each child was challenged to do their best, support each other and if they had run in the event last year, to beat their previous best.

In the girls competition Everlyn finished an incredible second place and the first year five girl. Alicia finished in 9th overall and 2nd year four girl, closely followed by Charlotte who finished 10th and 3rd for her age. Chloe J finished 11th overall, Chloe B 18th, Jasmine 21st, Maria 22nd, Abbie 23rd and Sophie H 24th. As a team our girls finished 3rd two points behind Fittleworth, with Duncton, who had five girls finish in the top eight places, winning the team event.

In the boys competition, Jacques won the overall event with a very impressive run. Lloyd finished 4th overall but 1st year five boy. Harry Wi finished 8th, Ben 9th, Kamen 11th, Archie 14th, Luke 18th, Tyler T 21st and Jack B 22nd. As a team our boys won the event by 10 points.

Well done to all of the runners as everyone completed the course and although tired most said they would do it again.

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PGL Little Canada 2018

Last weekend our year six children participated in their annual residential at Little Canada on the Isle of Wight. This experience gives children the opportunity to inspire, nurture and challenge themselves and their peers. The trip started with a dip in the sea with Kaycie leading the way. In all of the years I have been going to this beach I have never seen so many children eager to get into the water. It was great to see them exploring the water and sandbanks. This was a great start to the four days and it set the tone for exploration for the time we were away.

During the trip the children and teachers constantly had challenges which ranged from climbing higher, entering dark and gloomy spaces (tunnel trail) and problems to solve. The biggest challenge the teachers had was to stop Jacques from playing football! We were all pleasantly surprised at how the children went as far as they could and then a little bit further with a bit of persuasion. Luke typified this as he refused to abseil down the 10m wall after climbing the ladders to the top. After a few minutes at the bottom decided he wanted to go up again...Luke abseiled down three times. Great perseverance and resilience.

There were numerous funny moments during our trip....forgetting Charlotte was still at the top of All Aboard which is 10m high, in the wind and rain; children flossing as they abseiled; Abbie and Ollie reading while on the zip wire; Jacques reading aloud on the Giant Swing; Archie's impersonation of a lobster; the screams from most of the children on the Giant Swing. Each child and teacher will have their favourite moments.

As a parent or carer it is always worrying when your child is away and one of the biggest worries is, 'Will they eat enough?' Well rest assured they did! There was only one other school (six seventeen years olds), so we had plenty of opportunities for seconds. In fact it was difficult to get Kalin to stop eating!

During the four days the children abseiled, climbed 10m high poles, zip wired, problem solved, quad biked and much, much more. The children grow in confidence as they tackle activities they would not normally engage in and when you see children leaping off a 10m pole to catch the trapeze, who were at first reluctant to go beyond the 2m point, it enforces that all of our children can achieve with the right encouragement and environment.

As we returned to Portsmouth and said goodbye to Little Canada, the children saw the US aircraft carrier Harry S Truman, one of the around the world sailing boats, various British Navy boats, the hovercraft and plenty of sailing boats. It $_2$

gave us the opportunity to reflect and I am looking forward to reading all about the children's adventures through their writing.

I am always grateful to people giving up their free time and to give up a whole weekend goes way beyond their role. This trip would not have happened if it was not for Mr Neary, Mrs Gill and Mrs Carter.

EarlyBird Plus A NATIONAL AUTISTIC SOCIETY APPROACH.

Parents and professionals working together.

The EarlyBird Plus Approach is an autism specific approach to provide parents and a professional working with a child who has a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder, with information, support and practical advice

- Early Intervention for children and parents as soon as possible after diagnosis is considered vital.
 Parents have a need for support in the post diagnosis period.
- Involvement of parents in early intervention has been shown to have a positive effect.
 Parents and professionals working together can maximise consistent help for the child.

The age range for EarlyBird Plus is Year R to Year 3 (age 4 to 8 but not being 9 years of age before the start of the programme). EarlyBird Plus is available to teams of 3 adults: 2 parents/carers & a professional working with the child. There are places for 6-8 teams on each course.

Members of The Educational Psychology Service and Social Communication Team are accredited trainers of the above approach and we are able to offer parents of children attending mainstream schools the opportunity to participate in the programme. The next series of sessions will be held at Downview Primary School, Wroxham Way, Felpham, West Sussex, PO22 8R. Lizzie Lynas and Katherine be the trainers for this series of 8 sessions. Confirmed dates are the following Thursdays in 2019:

> 10th, 17th, 24th Jan 7th, 14th, 28th Feb 14th, 21st March

Time: 9.30am -12.15pm

Follow-up meeting: June (date tbc) dditionally one of the course tutors visits each family between sessions 3 & 4 and 6 & 7.
