Cricket Tournament

On Thursday June 6th the KS2 cricket team spent the day playing cricket at Watersfield, against Amberley and St James. Petworth played as a team first, then all the teams were split to make three mixed schools teams.

Everyone contributed to the tally of runs during their innings but some went that bit further; Ben and Lloyd both scored boundary 4s, Jacques hit four boundary 4s and Archie hit Petworth's only 6. Leo, James and Thomas built up a steady tally of runs throughout the tournament.

In fielding, once again Petworth really showed their team work in deep field, Lloyd, Archie and Hendricks in particular, scooping up balls and sending them directly to the wicketkeeper with accurate and lengthy throws, running out the opponents. James created barriers, beyond which the other team could not get the ball past.

Thomas, Archie, Ben and Hendricks all made one deep field catch; Jacques made four – all in one game.

Thomas's bowling was noted by the other adults – great technique, accurate and just the right amount of pace. They were even more surprised to learn that he was only year 4.

All in all, a great team event. They played supportively, worked together and learned from their mistakes to improve in subsequent games.

On Monday 17th June we participated in a stoolball tournament at Northchapel Primary School. It was a very good experience for our children, who may not have played this Sussex sport before.

We adorned our display with jungle-themed bunting, made by the children; it was clear to see that we have some very talented artists at Petworth.

Lexie and Maria, together with their families, were able to attend the awards ceremony at Chichester University, where we got a special mention for our entry and received a certificate of participation and a commemorative cup.

Following the ceremony, it was lovely to see members of the public, the Friends of Chartres Committee and even the Mayors of Chichester and Chartres, all trying on our masks and posing for photographs! It definitely proved popular with the visitors and staff at Art One.

The artwork is now destined for France, in order that it is displayed for the pupils and community of Chartres to enjoy. We would like to thank the children for their participation and hope to continue with an after-school art club again in the next academic year.
