

## PE and Sport Premium 2019 - 2020

The premium must be spent by schools on making additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

Objectives –

- o to improve the provision of physical education at Petworth CofE Primary School during lessons
- o to improve the extra-curricular activities provided and competitive intra and inter sport
- o to develop Play Leaders
- to engage reluctant participants
- o To improve teaching of P.E. at Petworth CofE Primary School by raising the confidence and expertise of class teachers
- o To promote children's experience of, and confidence with, the outdoor environment

Actions	Cost	Evaluation
Purchase:-  To ensure that all lessons and clubs have all the resources needed to be successful. Purchase school equipment to add to our school's diverse P.E. Curriculum including tablets to record performances and results. Also equipment for new sports e.g. table tennis and orienteering.  To purchase affiliation to Midhurst Rother College P.E. initiatives and Youth Sport Trust Sports news board, website, newsletter, social media will be publicised and maintained throughout the year and updated to show the increase in sports events and activities. Letters and permission slips, kits and transport organised.  Various pitch markings for new sports e.g. stoolball and grounds work	£3100	Orienteering course set up around the school and used by key stage two children; table tennis equipment bought and used in year four; tablets used to film and record scores for athletics;  Parents and the local community informed of the various sporting events our children have participated in.  School pictures mowed to allow school sports to take place; football pitches marked out.
Top Up Swimming - To ensure that by the end of KS2 more children (75%) are able to swim 25 meters.  Children receive top-up swimming sessions (year six) - most children will be able to swim 25 meters by the time they leave key stage two (including travel costs).	£900	No swimming has taken place due to Covid-19 and restrictions on swimming. Will look into having more swimming lessons in place for summer 2021.  64% of the children could swim 25m confidently.

To evaluate what we are doing in school and what we need to include ensuring we meet the criteria set for the School Games Mark.  To organise intra (six tournaments) / inter competitions for our children with some based on Olympic Sports and Sports Mark e.g. football, netball tournaments, cross country.  For children to be able to attend sports fixtures regularly (travel costs, teacher release).  To organise a Petworth Area Schools Olympic event	£2400 £1400	Eight intra school sports events took place over the academic year, which included handball, athletics, sitting volleyball and cross country. All events organised and led by year six children.  School participated in numerous inter school tournaments which included football tournaments (including at Lancing Football Club organised by Brighton F.C.), cross country, hockey, tag rugby, netball, basketball.  No Olympic event (postponed until Summer 2021); our school participated in the National School Sports Week for an athletics pentathlon. Every child in school (average 86 children) participated.
To develop and run a lunch time / after school club aimed at resistant participants of P.E. plus equipment.	£750	Twice weekly lunchtime club and led by a TA.
To develop a girls football club and pay for a coach for an after-school club for two terms.	£800	Girls football club ran for two terms. The club were run by an outside agency and had on average fourteen children attend from year three to year six each week.
Fund a P.E. expert to support teachers in their delivery of P.E. To raise the confidence of teaching and improve the learning opportunities for the children.  Support from dance coach expert	£2340	Sports coach supported teachers for two terms (Autumn and Spring) ranging from gymnastics, net and wall games, invasion games. Teachers have tem taught and developing their confidence and expertise in these areas.
	£1560	Dance sessions postponed due to them scheduled to take place in the summer term.
Contribution to Forest School - During the year every child will participate in Forest School education	£3950	For the Autumn and Spring terms children visited the woods to develop essential skills such as persistence, patience, teamwork, resilience. For each session at least three members of staff attended the sessions.
