

## PE and Sport Premium 2016 - 17

The premium must be spent by schools on making additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for trhe benfit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

Objectives -

- o to improve the provision of physical education at Petworth CofE Primary School during lessons
- o to improve the extra-curricular activities provided and competitive intra and inter sport
- to develop Play Leaders
- o to raise the profile of PE during National School Sports Week and engaging reluctant participants
- o To improve teaching of PE at Petworth CofE Primary School by raising the confidence and expertise of class teachers
- o To promote children's experience of, and confidence with, the outdoor environment

Forest School is providing opportunities to appreciate the outdoor environment, to engage with the rich natural diversity of the woodland environment to help build confidence, sensitivity, resilience and curiosity and to learn useful woodland skills.
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
