By the time the school day ended, children had cut, peeled and prepared fruit kebabs, built a replica of the Houses of Parliament from Lego, created wax resist art and sewn firework displays, among other things. At 3.30 they were able to embark on a number of games, variations on traditional school games, then enjoyed the food that they had prepared during the day cheese and tomato pinwheels, firework biscuits, fruit kebabs and a hot dog. A mug of hot chocolate rounded it all off before the evening ended with some campfire songs and stories about night time creatures.
