Sports Premium Report 2015/16

Petworth CofE Primary School appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of our children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement. The school community is committed to ensuring that all pupils receive PE each week, delivered by well-trained and enthusiastic teachers. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing children's physical literacy skills. Regular staff training opportunities are provided for teachers and teaching assistants (TAs) to keep them abreast of new initiatives.

It is our intention to run a Sports Week (which will coincide with National School Sports Week – 20th to 24th June) including competitive races for KS1 and KS2. Teachers and TAs provide a wide range of after school sports clubs, both for team and individual sports.

We are determined to promote sport for everyone and we are very eager to develop our intra and inter school sports. To achieve this we will need the support and commitment of parents, which is very much appreciated.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. In 2015/16 we received £8680. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Below is an outline of how we allocated the money and its impact.
