### PETWORTH & DISTRICT SWIMMING CLUB



Swimming lessons for children aged 4-16 in a family friendly environment





Petworth & District Swimming Club has been running for almost 50 years and has taught several generations of local people to swim. Originally swimming during the summer months at the open air pool in Petworth and at Haslemere in the winter, with the closure of our local pool we moved full time to Haslemere, where we have continued to teach children of all ages to swim.

For many years Petworth participated successfully in Swimming Galas, but in more recent times we have left the competitive side to other clubs and concentrated on teaching children to start to swim, growing through improving their swimming and water skills, strokes and life saving to ensure safety in the water at all times.

Diving, distance swimming, underwater skills, life saving - these are just some of the things children will learn through their weekly lessons with the Petworth & District Swimming Club.

We also encourage children to learn through



play and each month we have one family fun session In which parents, siblings and young friends can join our swimmers

while they practice the skills they are learning. These 'Splash' nights are a popular session and you will be encouraged to see the progress being made.

We are affillated to the Amateur Swimming Association (ASA) and offer a range of swimming badges and certificates acknowledging skills and distances attained.

Swimming is a skill for life - like riding a bicycle, once learned you never forget! Safety in the water is useful on so many levels, whether it is a holiday, a career or any water associated sport.

We are happy to take young children with no swimming skills and build their water confidence and encourage them to start swimming with arm bands and floats and gain the ability to begin their swimming journey. Adults and helpers are in the water with these young swimmers at all times.

As they progress, children will move up through a series of



classes learning new skills and techniques, improving their strokes and abilities in a comfortable family led club.

We currently have availability for new and improving swimmers within our club and are keen to meet with you so that we can show you what we can offer.
